If you felt unsafe or unhappy at school what would you do?	Tell a teacher Tell the helping club Talk to your friend Tell a prefect or School councillor Tell another trusted adult
If there was an emergency at school, what would you do?	Tell an adult Follow all instructions given Stay calm and quiet
How do you keep safe when using the computer?	Listen to what teacher says Don't give out personal information Don't drink near a computer Report strange messages or pictures or images Don't go onto restricted websites Don't go on games that are higher than our age
What does online safety mean to you? Why is it important?	Being careful online Not messaging or talking to strangers online Be kind to others online Don't click on things that you don't know what it is Don't share address or what school you go to It's important because you can be tracked down, scammed, you could be taken away, you could robbed.
If a friend is worried about an issue outside of school what would you do?	Tell an adult at school. Tell my parents Encourage your friend to tell a grown up at school themselves If it is really serious call the police or Childline
What would you do if you were worried about a test you were about to take?	Ask a teacher or parent for more help Study and revise more Tell your teacher you are worried
