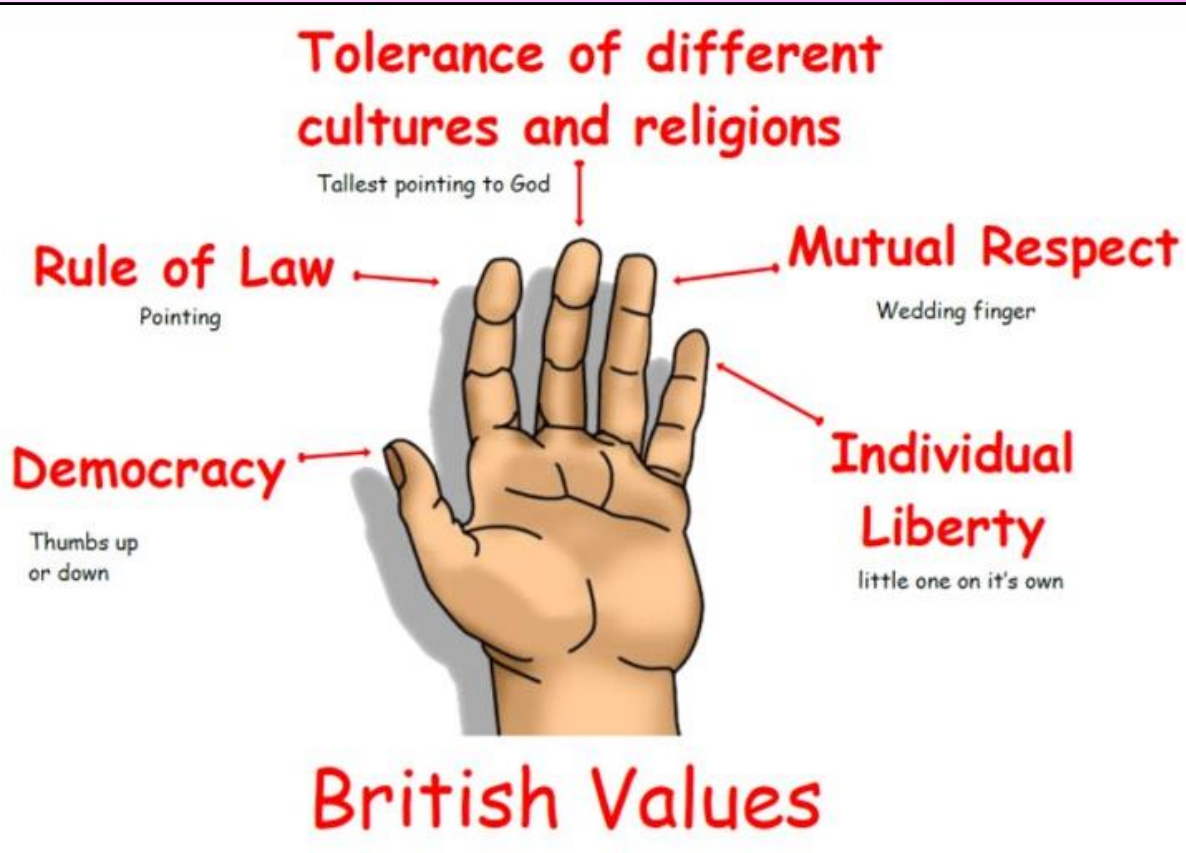

Value 1: Democracy

Value 2: Rule of Law

Rule of Law means that no matter who you are, while you are in Britain, you are protected by our laws.

religion



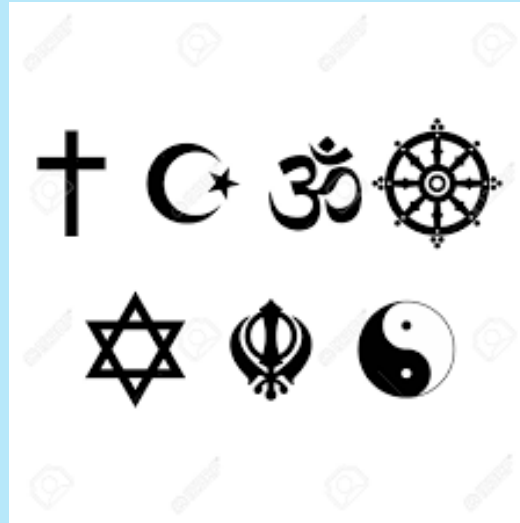
say you don't like the

Even though these rules seem normal to us, many countries don't have them. That is why we are proud of our values, they give us freedom and protection.

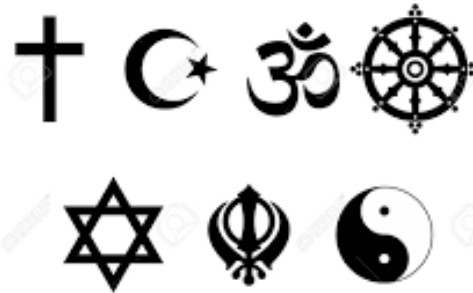
Value 3: Tolerance of all faiths and none

I believe God made the world



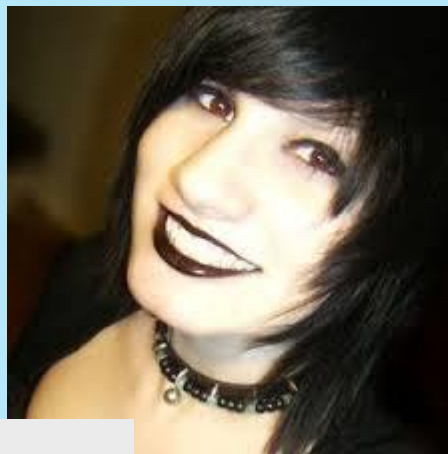
I believe that the Big Bang made the world
