What happens with the referral?

Referrals are screened and if suitable for multiagency consideration, are passed to the Channel team. Channel is an voluntary, multi-agency process designed to safeguard vulnerable people from being drawn into violent extremism or terrorist behaviour. Multi-agency partners work collectively to assess the risk to an individual, decide whether an intervention is necessary and develop appropriate support.

What to do if you have a concern

If you notice a change in an individual that concerns you, in that they may be vulnerable to radicalisation, follow our Prevent and Safeguarding policy. Talk to a DSL/contact the Prevent local co-ordinator. Share the concern by completing the Prevent referral form.
