What is Read Write Inc. Phonics?


Systematic approach

How can I help at home?

Storytime

- Read *to* your children
- Let them watch you reading.
- Ask lots of questions and share opinions when reading
- Read, read, read, read, read, read, read, read, read....

You're never too old, too wacky, too wild, to pick up a book and read to a child.

How can I help at home?

Talking and Vocabulary

- ▶ **Talk** to your child as much as possible and ‘feed’ them new and ambitious vocabulary.

“Let’s **eat** our lunch now.”

“Let’s **munch** our lunch now.”

“Let’s **scoff** our lunch now.”

“Let’s **devour** our lunch now!”

- ▶ Enrich conversations through description:

“Look at that rain. It looks like little diamonds sparkling on the window pane!”

- ▶ Have fun with words and language.

“I’m as hot as a spud in a cooking pot!”

Praise your child for using new words or interesting phrases
Use same terminology as school - pure sounds, Fred talk, Fred Fingers


Phonics Screening Check - Year 1 and

- ▶ All children in Year 1 throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check in June.
- ▶ The phonics screening check is designed to confirm whether children have learnt phonic decoding and blending skills to an appropriate standard.
- ▶ The test contains 40 words. Each child will sit one-to-one and read each word aloud to a teacher. The test will take approximately 10 minutes per child.
- ▶ Children are tested on 20 real words and 20 non-sense words.
- ▶ We decide whether it is appropriate for children to take the phonics screening check.
- ▶ Reporting to parents: By the end of the summer term all schools must report each child's results to their parents. They will also confirm if the child has met the standard threshold. Children who do not achieve the expected level will retake the test when they are in Year 2.

SATs - Year 2 only

- ▶ National Tests taken in Summer term. These tests have become optional from this year, however as a Rainbow MAT we have decided that children will still complete them. We have chosen to still sit them to inform our Teacher assessment. These will be sat like any other quiz the children take throughout the year. No stress and nothing to worry about.
- ▶ Maths, Reading, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Tests
- ▶ Writing is teacher assessed.
- ▶ Time to have a go in school, but curriculum is not reduced for SATs - just to prepare, so it is not new when children first see the test papers.
- ▶ Small groups to complete the assessments with known adults.



English - Talk for Writing

- ▶ Imitate – Talk the text and story mapping
- ▶ Innovate – change the text
- ▶ Invent – write our own version



Maths- mixed age teaching

- ▶ Down from 5 to 4 teachers
- ▶ Mixed age teaching allows more scope for working within mathematical ability. Higher adult: learner ratio, allowing for children to receive extra support and for extensions/ challenge.
- ▶ We are using the 'Hamilton Brookes' programme to plan for mixed age teaching which ensures that all objectives are met for both year groups.
- ▶ The whole class teaching is designed to start off with Year 1 content, then progress onto the Year 2 content. Each year group has specifically focused year group tasks which are adapted to their mathematical ability.

These calculation guides will be sent home in Home Learning books. They will be great at home if you are supporting your child with Maths. They show the different methods that we will use to teach your child.






